
2:20-2:30pm finish (as Christmas)

School Games Mark

The School Games Mark aims to provide every child with a positive experience in an environment where the young person's motivation, competence and confidence are at the centre of the competition.

The government's plan for childhood obesity and their ambition is to require all young people to be active (moderate to vigorous physical activity) for at least 60 minutes every day. 30 minutes required is parental responsibility and 30 minutes required is within the school day. In school, the children throughout Key Stage 1 and 2 will be taking part in intraschool based competitions each week. This will provide them with the opportunity to practise their skills, keep active and take part in competitions throughout play and lunchtime break. The children will also have their P.E. sessions and take part in the daily mile. Opportunities for interschool competitions (competing against other schools) will hopefully take place in the summer term.

This year, we will be aiming to achieve The School Games Mark, which will recognise our commitment to developing competition within school and into the community to allow the children to compete and achieve their personal best.
